The main buildings of Oriental fisherman's wharf mainly shape themselves two huge fish: a "leaping fish" and a "sleeping fish", casting beautiful reflections and forming a unique style. In terms of function, the buildings act as a modern intelligent Class A office building and a catering oriented comprehensive shopping center.

Shanghai Hacker–Pschorr, located at the south of the "sleeping fish", is a consumption project newly introduced by Oriental Fisherman's Wharf. With the advantages of being adjacent to the water front of Huangpu River, Hacker–Paschorr not only provides customers with unique consumption experience gained from the riverside platform, the wharf, etc., but also adds a fresh bright spot to the development of green industry of Binjiang Development Zone.

"As one of the headstreams of Westernization Movement of China, Yangshupu Road has been a pride of the people in Shanghai since 19th century. China's first power plant, first gashouse, first water plant, first textile mill and first fishery market were born here, and their scales all were ranked first in the Far East at that time. Just like Fisherman's Wharf in San Francisco, when the fishery wharf close to China's first fish market lost its original functions, it was transformed into a leisure space with unique characteristics after careful planning, that is, Yangpu Oriental Fisherman's Wharf. "

According to the introduction of the operator of Oriental Fisherman's Wharf, with the advancing of Yangpu Binjiang Development Project, the bund of Huangpu River will relive the prosperous heyday of the past.

The insurance pavilion displays more than 300 pieces (group) of cultural relics, including insurance policy of Canton Insurance Society, insurance policy of Renhe Insurance, seals of Lv Yuequan, badges of Shanghai Insurance Fraternity Society and so forth, which completely demonstrates the vicissitudes of the insurance industry of modern China.

The tax receipt pavilion exhibits rare receipts of agricultural tax, commodity tax, stamp tax, etc. and two tax receipt collections—Wine and Tobacco Taxes of Republic of China (1912–1949), Local Stamp Taxes of Western China, which won the world stamp exhibition gold award. This pavilion aims to show the history of tax, circulate tax knowledge, promote tax culture and serve the finance and taxation cause.

The currency pavilion is divided into three exhibition areas: the Chinese currencies in previous ages composed of nearly 300 ancient coins, the modern Chinese currencies, including five sets of Renminbi and existing currencies in circulation of Hong Kong and Macao, and the world's 146 currencies in circulation of various countries. This pavilion is to play back the historical development of currency and help visitors feel the development and changes of economy and experience the communication and combination of civilizations.

The calculation tool pavilion traces the history of the calculation tools of mankind, exhibits abacuses of various forms, structures and materials and hand calculators around the world, to reveal the colorful cultures and artistic contents of Chinese and western calculation tools.

During the closing ceremony of the 2nd China Collegiate Computing Contest–Mobile APP Innovation Contest, Hu Beini's APP won the special prize of the contest. In addition, Step Beats, the first prize winner, focuses on sports–loving musicians.

The APP can make everyone a musician. Based on personalized running characteristics, ever-changing running speed and stride frequency, the APP helps you create and share your own music. Meanwhile, it also gives music lovers a brand new creation way: "input" ideas and "generate" music by running.

The team leader of Step Beats is Li Chenxiao, a sophomore student

from Zhejiang University. All the members of his team are Generation Z-ers – today's youngest group born in 1995 or later.

"Since I had an iPhone during my high school, I have wished that my own product could appear in the Apple store one day, so I learnt a lot of knowledge about programming and software. After entering the university, I continuously pursue my dream and met like—minded partners, and thus my dream was realized," said Li Chenxiao.

Will the development of mobile App affect studies? Zhang Lekai, leader of iAFUN team of Zhejiang University and winner of special prize of the 1st China Collegiate Computing Contest held last year, said that, although the contest would cost them a lot of energy, the contest was correlated with the orientation of his art design research, so his mentor supported him to participate in the contest." After one year's accumulation, our APP has been downloaded 6 million times, and now we are developing the third APP", said Zhang Lekai.

It is known that the Mobile APP Innovation Contest, officially launched in March this year, was jointly sponsored by Zhejiang University and Apple Inc. and is one of the main contest modules of China Collegiate Computing Contest. The contest attracted more than 5,000 registered students, more than 2,000 participants and the contest area is continuously expanding.

The students from more than 200 colleges and universities submitted 453 works, covering health, medical care, elderly service education, environmental protection, flood prevention and relief, industry, agriculture, security, big data application, administration and other fields.
